What Are Their Living Conditions?

Santiago is a senior citizen, unemployed, and wheelchair-bound.

He lives in Yahuarhuaca, 660 baños del Inca, Cajamarca. His house is made of brick with plywood partitions.

He lives with his wife, María Cortes, from Potosí, who is 83 years old. She is elderly and does not work and dedicates herself to caring for her husband. They have a daughter who works as a receptionist at a local hotel. She is the sole breadwinner for their household, and their granddaughter, who is currently in secondary school, is currently studying.

The family is a believer in the Faith. The woman tells us that she would like to read the Bible, but she cannot read and is illiterate.

Describe The Types Of Needs This Individual Has.

Sometimes they don't have money for lunch. They are severely strapped for cash, as their daughter's sole income barely covers some household needs. The Peruvian government's "glass of

milk" program has stopped supporting seniors.

One of the biggest challenges they face in their area is that they are not close to public transportation, making it very difficult for them because they are seniors.

How Did This Donation Meet These Needs And Make A Lasting Impact?

Older adults are suffering from malnutrition. The arrival of rice is a good option for improving their nutrition. It has a lasting impact because we have shared a message of Jesus' love and a time of prayer for them.

What Are Their Living Conditions?

Mr. Santiago currently does not work because he is elderly. His daughter provides financial support and care for his parents. He lives with his wife, Rosa Sebastiana Cerquin de Ramirez, 85. His daughter, Gladys Ramirez, is a nursing technician but cares for her parents Monday through Friday. She only works Saturdays and Sundays. She has a 2-year-and-4-month-old son. His other sister works in the fields raising animals and only comes home on weekends to help her parents.

This family is also religious. Mr. Adolfo's hand is currently swollen, and despite the medical tests he has undergone, they cannot determine the cause. The swelling is very noticeable and causes a lot of fatigue and stress.

They currently live in the house of one of their two daughters, Gladys.

Mrs. Rosa and Cesar's house was made of adobe, but it collapsed due to heavy rains, flooding the house and no longer exists. They lived there without water, electricity, or drainage. It was in Zepita, "formerly Huayrapongo Chico," in Cajamarca.

Describe The Types Of Needs This Individual Has.

One of the primary needs is to restore Mr. Cesar's hand, which is in severe pain, and to restore the condition of his home's roof, which is deteriorating.
