Why Were The Items Distributed Here? What Are The Greatest Needs In This Community?

Our volunteers participated once again in the Wings of Hope program sponsored by the Peruvian Air Force guide providing medical campaigns to remote parts of the country. This trip was hosted at San Martín School in Tambo - Ayacucho, Tambo is a small rural community made up of mainly indigenous and Andean inhabitants. Over 87 percent of the population speak Quechua as their native language. Spanish is the secondary language and is spoken more by the younger inhabitants. The local economy is primarily agrarian, focusing on subsistence farming, traditional Andean crops, and livestock. The greatest need for the area is economic since their crops are totally dependent on weather and having a good year. There is also a need for greater medical care. Medical services in the area are very limited (thus one of the reasons for the selection for this 3 day medical campaign.)

Thanks to World Help we were able to provide individuals and families with items such as Mannapack, sandalwood and T-shirts.

Kattia, one of our CDV volunteers, took two buckets of Kids Care to deliver to two families within the community.

Why Were The Items Distributed Here? What Are The Greatest Needs In This Community?

The Pediatric Emergency Hospital is a public state hospital located in the La Victoria district of Lima, Peru. It specializes in the care of pediatric emergencies for children and adolescents from newborns to 17 years of age.

This center lacks many resources, which is why it cannot cope with the large number of children arriving with illnesses. It is overwhelmed with cases and situations requiring attention, and the demand is too high. The area where it is located is also very dangerous due to crime.

On this occasion, we distributed Care Kits to all the parents who were there with their children. We learned about the case of Alondra Saldivar Garcia, a two-year-old girl. Her mother told us that they live an hour from the hospital. Alondra had been suffering from diarrhea for four days. She was undergoing bacterial culture testing and had received IV fluids. She had needles in her arm and cried incessantly. We spent some time talking and praying for them.

Why Were The Items Distributed Here? What Are The Greatest Needs In This Community?

Yurúa is a district located in the province of Atalaya, in the department of Ucayali in the Peruvian Amazon. Due to its remote and rugged location, it has no roads and can only be accessed by small plane flights from Pucallpa, which are highly dependent on good weather. It faces a situation of extreme vulnerability and chronic state neglect. The most critical needs in this area are the lack of potable water; residents consume rainwater from wells, which causes frequent stomach illnesses in children. Furthermore, there is no permanent electricity grid, and the lack of power limits daily life, local businesses, and under-supplied health posts. Since the population depends exclusively on hunting, fishing, and subsistence farming, any environmental disturbance generates scarcity. There is also a presence of drug trafficking; the isolation is exploited by illegal networks for illicit drug trafficking. And there is an absence of police control; border checkpoints lack sufficient personnel and logistics to safeguard the sovereignty and security of the native communities.

The local schools They suffer from a lack of teachers and adequate educational materials. Difficult access means that teachers are slow to arrive or that places remain empty for much of the school year.

What Are Their Living Conditions?

In the middle of this place we met Mirian and her family. They live in an inhospitable and very poor place in the countryside. Their house is made of wood and straw and they do not have basic services such as drinking water, electricity or internet. Their livelihood is agriculture; they grow bananas and papayas only for their consumption and raise chickens. They have 6 grandchildren,

one of whom has anemia, so they do not have medical attention for his treatment.

Describe The Types Of Needs This Individual Has.

They lack access to clean drinking water, filtered water to prevent parasites and chronic childhood malnutrition, and emergency health care and basic pharmaceutical products to combat infections such as malaria and dengue.

How Did This Donation Meet These Needs And Make A Lasting Impact?

On this occasion, we blessed them with a care kit, thus strengthening their education with the children's school requirements: notebooks and pens, clothing, among other basic items. In the future, they will use the bucket to collect water. We had a time of the word of God and prayer; Mrs. Mirian and her brother accepted God into their hearts.
