What Was The Crisis And When Did It Take Place?

Aliyan, born in 1989, previously lived in Sinjar, a border area to Mosul with a predominantly Yazidi population. He was forced to leave due to the war and the events that took place there, including the massacre committed against the Yazidis in that region. He moved to Erbil and has been residing in this camp for the past six years.

Aliyan works as a daily wage laborer with irregular employment, meaning he may only work a few days per week and does not have a stable income. He is married to a Syrian woman, and according to the regulations of the Iraqi camp administration, Iraqi residents who are married to Syrian nationals are not eligible to receive assistance or food rations.

Despite this, he came to the distribution point and stood waiting in the hope of receiving a share of assistance.
